Aerodrome Walk

On Saturday 24th November an "Open Day" for RAF Hornchurch was held, not very well publicised though! This consisted of an exhibition about the airfield at the RJ Mitchell School and 2 guided walks around the Hornchurch Country Park, which is the site of the old airfield. My wife and I managed to find time to go on the afternoon walk and I suspect the exhibition was the display that the Purfleet Heritage group brought along a few years ago.

A group of about 20 people with the guide set off from the Squadrons Approach parking area, which is one of the original E pens used to house Blenheims based at the airfield. We were taken from there round the back of to see one of the gun enclosures, in this case the base for the Naval 3 inch gun sited there as part of the base defences. From there we walked along one of the main tracks which skirts the park and follows what it pretty much the

perimeter track. Along the way we were shown the remaining pillboxes and one man turrets sunk into the ground topped off with a concrete ring to mount a machine gun in. Some of the other E pens are still around but are disguised under the contours of the ground. Unfortunately a lot of the history of the area has been lost as the main runway areas were cleared during the gravel extraction phase of the airfields history, the only areas of interest/archaeology are now contained around the edges of the park. There was a program called "Two Men In A Trench" a few years ago which featured the airfield, the guide was saying that much of what was "discovered" on the program they already knew about, they just had to spoon feed the presenters and point them in the right direction. There doesn't appear to be a DVD of the program available at the moment but the Hornchurch dig is detailed in the 2nd book (ISBN 0718145941) of the same name as the series.

One other item of interest is that they are hoping to build a visitors centre in about 5 years time and have a small display about the airfield. I suggested it might be interesting if the club could build some models to show some of the planes which flew from Hornchurch. I'm not sure whether the suggestion sank in but it would be worth keeping an eye open to see if the plans ever get going and liaising with them again.

If you do have an interest in the local history I can thoroughly recommend a visit to the park.
