

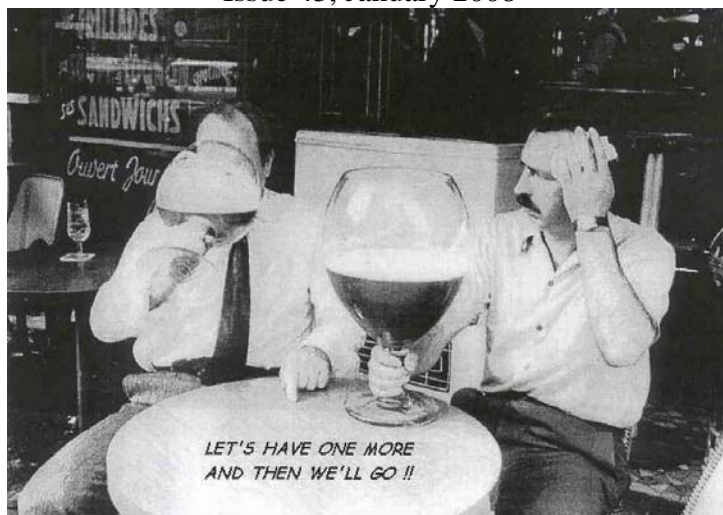

Airfix have caused a stir by apparently announcing their intention to make a 1/24th scale Mosquito. It was apparently supposed to have been in preparation just before one of the company's now legendary financial crisis, looks like it now may be completed. Revell have announced a 1/32nd Junkers Ju-88 and perhaps surprisingly a 1/48th Mosquito.

Directions to Milton Keynes - By Car From the North or South

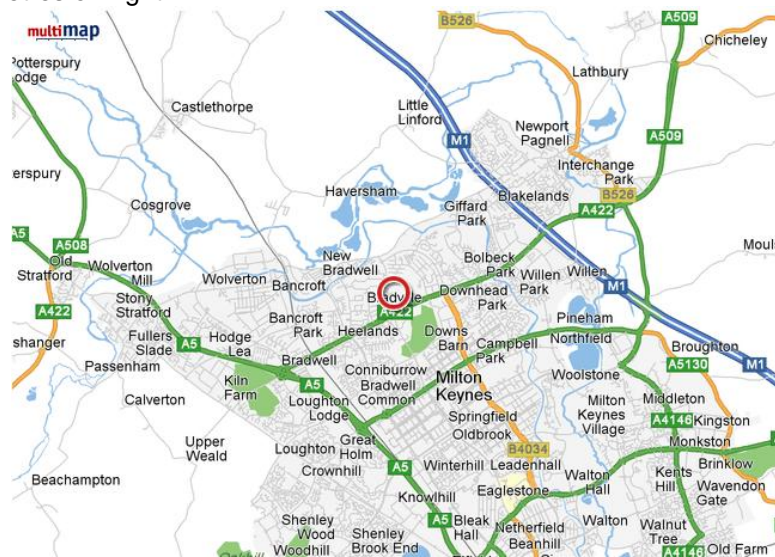
Leave junction 14 of the M1 and travel towards Newport Pagnell - A509

Continue over next 4 roundabouts (Marsh End), (Blakelands), (Great Linford), (Redbridge)

Turn right at next roundabout (Stantonbury)

Campus entrance 100 metres on right
