
Southend (IPMS South East Essex) Judging

Aircraft were predominant (not too dissimilar to our club), with armour and cars and cars being the next popular. We had a slight delay as one person had forgotten their models as they thought the competition was next

I live in hope if I die in despair, I guess but at least I'm having a go and enjoying the challenge. You'll see how far I've got at Monday nights club night.

I asked him why he was at such a small show and he told me it was on his way to pick up a collection, naturally I asked where he was going, to which he replied Penzance in Cornwall. I must buy him a map for Christmas. However, while perusing his stock I spied a couple of rally car kits, no I haven't gone to the dark side, a friend at my works builds them and a phone call later they were in my bag at a good price. Vince then picked a Hasegawa Tomcat in 48th scale out of a box and shook the box, rattle, rattle. Rather than check that all the parts were there and take the risk that parts were missing he offered the kit to either Peter or myself at a silly price sight unseen, of course Peter turned down the offer as he doesn't build 48th scale in that size. I did a quick guesstimate and said yes as I figured that even if a few bits were missing it would be worth it for the fuel tanks, any weapons TARPS pod, figures and seats. Later in the day Peter and I went through the box and checked all the parts against the plans and surprisingly from such a noisy box, all the parts were there and all for under a tenner! Around lunchtime I spotted under a table an Eduard triple boxing of JV44 aircraft, the box contained two long nosed Fw.190's in 48th and a Me.262 in 144th, the Fw.190's of JV44 was the unit that ran airfield protection for Me.262's taking off

and landing, the undersides were painted in bright red with white stripes in the hope that the airfield Flak would be able to tell friend from foe during the low level dogfights, reading some of my books, a bit of a vain hope I think. The box containing all three models was £28, so that ended up in my bag. A total left field job was a Nieuport Ni-11 I saw as we were packing up, I just saw the colour scheme and said yes please and stuffed it in my bag. We packed the cars and headed off home, Ian with his top down and us with a metal roof, given the number of wet patches on the roads and the dark rain clouds that surrounded us on the way home, I'm pleased we had a tin lid over us.
