





I'll bring them along to the club night as usual. After the usual prize giving and speeches the show drew to a close and we packed up the stand and made our way homeward. Although the inevitable roadworks, with nobody working of course, delayed us a bit, the tunnel was pretty clear and we got through quickly. I think everybody enjoyed themselves and I would recommend the show to anybody.
